





This is the second year that both events have been held at the same site. It should provide for a day of most exciting spectator entertainment in this beautiful facility.



## 1972

### Stranahan does it again, wins 1972 state championship

Suffice it to say, Fort Lauderdale Stranahan entered the 1972 state wrestling tournament confident. And why not? Stranahan returned three champions in Mike and Charles Collins and Willie Dixon.

And the three didn't disappoint. All three defended their titles and allowed Stranahan to do the same, winning the '72 team title.

The three Stranahan wrestlers weren't the only ones to defend titles. Two others also did it: Ted Alexander of Punta Gorda Charlotte and Charles Mack of Miami Southwest.

Sophomore Joe Ruffin of Miami Northwestern won the first of two state titles. He did it again as a senior in 1974.

# 1973

## Coral Park wins West Coast team finally cracks top three

Though the 1973 state tournament was held at Fort Lauderdale Stranahan High School, Miami Coral Park broke Stanahan's two-year hold on the team championship. Coral Park, coached by Ron Balazs, finished with 43½ points to claim the title, their second.

But it was the Bradenton Manatee team which turned heads. The Hurricanes, coached by Ed Goodpasture, finished second with 37½ points to become the first team on the West Coast ever to finish among the top three teams.

Miami Palmetto was third with 34½ points.

# 1974

## Late win by Alex DeCubas lifts Miami Palmetto past Coral Park

There were just two matches left, and the 1974 state wrestling tournament still was without a champion. That changed when sophomore Alex DeCubas stepped forward and won the 189-pound title to give Miami Palmetto a two-point win over defending champion Miami Coral Park.

Palmetto won its first state championship with 36½ points. Coral Park finished with 34½. Both teams crowned a pair of individual champions.

An upstart program surfaced for the first time in the 1974 tournament when Brandon finished third with 29 points. More would be heard from Coach Jim Graves' teams in the years to come.

## Fort Lauderdale Stranahan returns to winning ways

It didn't take Fort Lauderdale Stranahan long to win another state championship. After winning back-to-back titles in 1971-72, Stranahan won again in the 1975 tournament at Tampa Jefferson High School.

Stranahan scored most of its 36 points with its two individual champions, Holder at 130 pounds and Konter at 136.

Two wrestlers repeated as state champions: Vic Gonzalez of Miami Killian at 149 pounds and Jeff Cutler of Miami Palmetto at 159 pounds. Both won their first state titles in 1974, Gonzalez at 142 and Cutler at 159.

## Miami Palmetto wins title by a whopping 32½ points

Quick starts were never a problem for the 1976 Miami Palmetto wrestling team. It had three of the best wrestlers in the state at 102, 109 and 116 pounds. They were good enough to seal the school's first state championship at Winter Park High School.

Palmetto's Flowers won a state title at 102 pounds, Pedersen at 109 pounds. Ghezzi was third at 116. But Palmetto had a strong finish as well in Alex DeCubas, the 189-pound winner who also won that weight in 1974.

Palmetto won the tournament by a record 32½-point margin. Palmetto scored 85½ points, while runner-up Miami Killian finished with 53.

## Brandon finally breaks southern hold on state tournament

Through the FHSAA's first 12 state wrestling tournaments, from 1965-76, schools from Miami won nine team championships, while schools from Fort Lauderdale won the other three. State tournament results made any part of the state north of Broward County seem like desert waste land.

That changed during the 1977 tournament at Miami-Dade North Community College. Brandon became the first team outside of Dade or Broward counties to win the championship when the Jim Graves-coached Eagles scored 58½ points for their first state title. Brandon has since followed it up with three more championship under Russ Cozart, who replaced Graves as head coach during the 1980-81 season.

Wrestling in Florida was never to be the same after the '77 tournament. The following year, the FHSAA broke the state tournament into two categories — Class 3A and 4A — and crowned two champions every year.

Brandon used four wrestlers to win the '77 crown. Richard Lewis won the 171-pound championship. John Cleveland was second at 149, while Robert Ludlum was third at 142. Chuck Link didn't place at 130 pounds, but he did score four points for the Eagles.

Brandon clinched the tournament before the first championship match was even wrestled since second-place Winter Park had no finalists. Winter Park, which finished with 49½ points, had three third-place finishers: T. Anderson at 109 pounds, S. Beaudoin at 116 and R. Hetrick at 123.

## Brandon claims 'the tournament nobody wanted to win' — barely

Brandon coach Russ Cozart calls it "the tournament nobody wanted to win."

Cozart's Eagles took full advantage of everyone's hospitality in the 1982 Class 4A state wrestling tournament, winning the team championship without putting anyone in the finals. Brandon won the event with two third-place and one fourth-place finish.

The Eagles finished with 60½ points. Panama City Mosley was second with 60 points. Bradenton Manatee was third at 55, Winter Park fourth at 52 and Miami Killian fifth at 50. Of the five, the least likely winner was Brandon.

Pat Melton took third for Brandon at 123 pounds. Stanley Scott did the same at 224. Alex Ippolito was fourth at 171. After the consolation finals, the Brandon team became spectators for the championship finals. They watched one team after another lose the tournament.

Mosley fell ½-point behind when Keith Everitt lost to Carlos Soronco of Hollywood McArthur, 6-3, in the 142-pound final. Mosley's Lewis won the 171 title by default, but it was too late.

Manatee lost the championship when John Cucci defaulted to Lewis at 171. Manatee's Brian Skelton won the 116-pound division, 9-3, over Robbie Randle of Tampa Hillsborough.

You could see Naples Lely's 1983 Class 3A state championship coming for a mile. Or a year, anyway.

## Brandon becomes first team to defend title in four years

It was the year of the undefeated wrestler — eight made it through the 1985 Class 4A state tournament at Tampa Leto High School without a loss — but it was also the year Brandon held on to its claim as state champion.

After winning the Class 4A title in 1984, the Eagles did it again in '85, outscoring runner-up North Miami, 91½-82. It was Brandon's third championship in the last four years.

Two Brandon wrestlers won titles and three more finished among the top four in their weight class. Robert Hendrickson won the 109-pound division, while Chris Denison claimed the 224-pound class. They were: North Miami's Roger Bernstein (28-0 at 102), Miami Sunset's Moises Rivera (31-0 at 123), Merritt Island's Solomon Fleckman (34-0 at 130), Jacksonville Sandalwood's Tim Mellot (26-0 at 142), Seminole's Mark Surette (32-0 at 159), Merritt Island's Tony McCormick (33-0 at 171) and Miami Norland's Clyde Montgomery (23-0 at 189).

After winning state championships in Ohio in 1983 and '84, McCormick won his first in Florida in '85. The Merritt Island wrestler added a second in '86, his senior year.

## Fort Myers ends eight-year drought with Class 3A title

Fort Myers ended an eight-year drought when the Green Wave won the 1987 Class 3A state wrestling tournament. Fort Myers previously won team championship in 1978 and 1979.

The Green Wave finished with 79 points, 15 ahead of runner-up Hollywood McArthur. Fort Myers Riverdale was third with 51 points, followed by Bradenton Bayshore (43½), Naples Barron Collier (43½), Orlando Bishop Moore (41), Fort Lauderdale St. Thomas Aquinas (37), Riverview East Bay (37), Fort Lauderdale Western (35) and Leesburg (34½).

Scott Gonyo won Fort Myers' only individual title, edging Travis Blaise of Naples Barron Collier by criteria at 102 pounds.

Paul Tritel finished second at 142 pounds for the winners, while Dan Chrivian was third at 109, Aaron Danzig third at 116 and Tom Strickland fourth at 136.

McArthur had three wrestlers reach the finals, but each lost. Finishing second were Rick Lopez at 109, Mike Rhett at 189 and Carey Bryant (unlimited).

Heavyweight Willie McGrady of Palatka became only the eighth wrestler in the state to win three or more individual state titles. He edged Joe Cornelius of Leesburg, 5-2, in the final.

Dana Wilkes of Crystal River earned his second state title when he handled Steve Williams of Fort Lauderdale Nova, 9-0, in the 152-pound final.

One state champion wasn't able to repeat. Bradenton Bayshore's Ricky Gullett, a 1986 winner, lost to Donald Yocum of Stuart Martin County by criteria in the 159 final.


